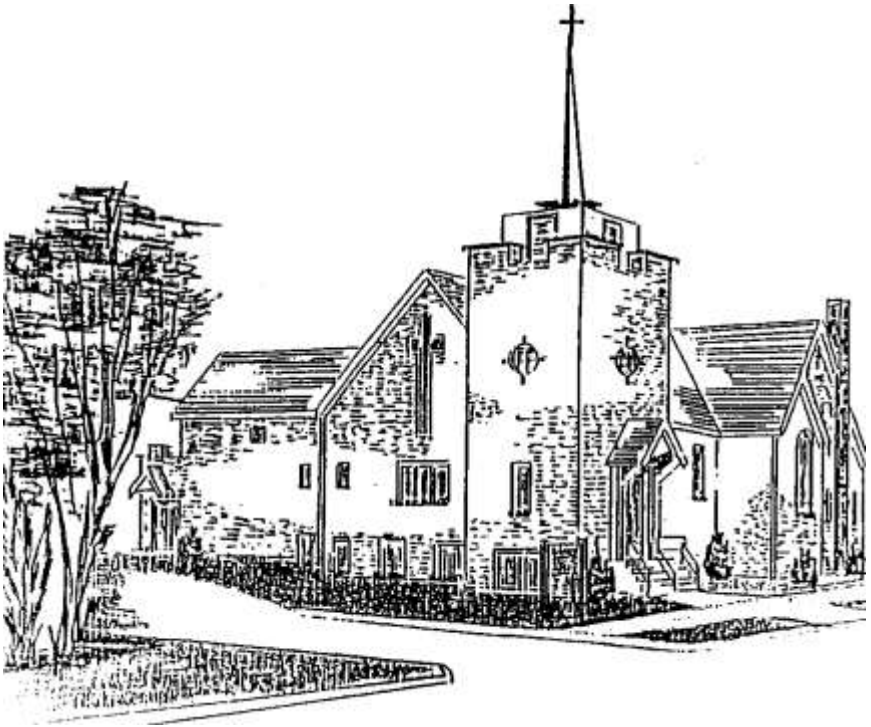

- 1 pair reusable rubber gloves, size L (Platex gloves or similar)
- 1 pair leather work gloves, size L
