

Summer Stewardship Thoughts

With spring soon turning to summer, I want to take a moment to remind all of us at Hope Lutheran Church of a few important things as it pertains to our lives of discipleship in Jesus Christ as we enter the summer season.

First, I realize that with the summer break from our school year schedules, many families take advantage of that time to take vacations. I also know that some of these may take you away from home on a given Sunday morning. When that happens, remember in the Third Commandment, we're encouraged to "remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy" which Martin Luther explains in the Small Catechism to mean: "We should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and God's Word, but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it." This applies even if we don't happen to be home to attend worship at Hope on a given Sunday morning.

If you happen to find yourself away from home on a given Sunday this summer, there are a few ways you can continue to remember the Sabbath day. First, you can visit a sister NALC church if there is one near where your travels are taking you! If you need help finding one, please let me know before you leave. Odds are, I may even know the pastor in that location, and I know any of our congregations of the NALC would love to have you join them for worship anytime. Second, you can always continue to worship with your church family at Hope by catching the livestream of our worship service on the church's YouTube channel either live or on demand. Bonnie almost always has the bulletin for the coming Sunday on the website so you can follow along with the service, and stay up to date on what is happening while you are away.

Finally, I'd encourage you to take things a step further, and take a few moments each day to get into the Word of God for devotions and prayer.

The Time of the Church: The Season of Pentecost

The Time of the Church is the season of the church year that begins the day after Pentecost and ends with midday prayer on the Saturday before the First Sunday in Advent. This year, the Time of the Church began on Monday, May 20 and will end on Saturday, November 30. The Sundays after Pentecost make up the longest portion of the church year. It is often referred to as the Time of the Church because it is the time of the year we focus on growing together in the life of God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

On the First Sunday after Pentecost, the Church celebrates Holy Trinity Sunday. We remember we are baptized into only one name, but that name is "of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." There is only one name, only one God, but there are three persons, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. On Trinity Sunday, we confess the great mystery of the Holy Trinity.

The Sundays of this time of the church year are known as the Sundays after Pentecost. Picking up on the theme of this being the season of growth, they are often referred to as the "Green Sundays." The Scripture readings from the lectionary during this time focus our attention on the life of Christ in His Church. We often hear Gospel readings in which Jesus is teaching His disciples, and healing the faithful.

Because this season is part of what is called "Ordinary" time, some churches might choose to observe some of the lesser festivals of the season. When saint days or commemorations on the church calendar fall on a Sunday, churches will sometimes highlight these as teaching moments about the breath of the Church's life and work. These days enable Christians to reflect on how we worship "with angels, archangels, and the entire company of heaven."

On the last Sunday after Pentecost (Christ the King), the Church gives voice to the joyful hope of the second coming of Jesus for the resurrection of the dead and the last judgment. The end times focus of the last Sundays of the church year bear themes of hope and preparation that are similar to those we see in Advent, which will soon follow.


