Follow Me

The next day Jesus decided to go to Galilee. He found Philip and said to him, "Follow me." Now Philip was from Bethsaida, the city of Andrew and Peter. Philip found Nathaniel and said to him, "We have found him of whom Moses in the Law and also the prophets wrote, Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph." Nathaniel said to him, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" Philip said, "Come and see." Jesus saw Nathaniel coming toward him and said of him, "Behold, an Israelite indeed, in whom there is no deceit!" Nathaniel said to him, "How do you know me?" Jesus answered him, "Before Philip called you, when you were under the fig tree, I saw you." Nathaniel answered him, "Rabbi, you are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!" Jesus answered him, "Because I said to you, 'I saw you under the fig tree' do you believe? You will see greater things than these."-John 1:43-50

As many of you know, in addition to serving as your Pastor here at Hope and Glen Flora, for the past four years, I've served on, and am currently chair, of one of our Mission Teams that make up the Missions Office of the North American Lutheran Church (NALC): the Renewal Team. Our Team's work is focused on development and recommendation of practical resources for the renewal and mission to our congregations, Pastors, and other workers in the NALC, with a more recent focus on the needs of Small and Rural churches, which make up a good majority of the NALC's membership.

It is through my service as chair of the Renewal Team that I first encountered the "Joining Jesus" book series by Lutheran Pastor Greg Finke, director of Dwelling 1:14 Ministries, and it has since become a resource our Team highly recommends to congregations

looking at renewal initiatives. His first book in the series is "Joining Jesus on His Mission: How to Be an Everyday Missionary", a book that I led Hope's council in reading last year, and several other members of Hope have been reading and discussing this year. (If you are interested in acquiring a copy or starting a study of the book, let me know!) The entire premise of Pastor Finke's work and ministry is, from a Biblical perspective, how we as Christians are in many ways, "missionaries" in our own communities through the relationships that we develop in the workplace, our neighborhoods, on the farm, in our places of business, in our schools, and wherever else it is that God places us in daily life. Pastor Finke does an outstanding job of simplifying this entire model of sharing the love of Christ and how it happens simply by being aware of what's going on in our own little corner of the world, and using opportunities we have to share Christ's love in the relationships that we build each day.

As followers of Jesus, we should have a desire to share the good news of Christ, and what He has done for us through His life, death, and resurrection, with others. In the Scripture reading from John 1 that I shared with you, we see this very thing happening. Jesus goes to Galilee where he encounters Philip. There, Jesus issues a call to discipleship to Philip, simply by saying "Follow me." Philip spends time with Jesus, has his life transformed, and then when he returns and sees Nathaniel, what does he say to Nathaniel? Does he act as if nothing special has happened? No. He tells Nathaniel "We have found him of whom Moses in the Law and also the prophets wrote, Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph." (v. 45) Philip couldn't wait to share the good news about Jesus with Nathaniel.

Now Nathaniel doesn't give the most encouraging answer right away does he? "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" (v.46) Yet, Philip is undeterred. He doesn't spend his time arguing with Nathaniel until he's blue in the face or tell him he's crazy. He also doesn't give up, either. He simply issues an invitation. "Come and see." (v.46) Come and see Jesus for yourself, Nathaniel. Spend some time in His presence. And with that simple invitation, Nathaniel hears the Word of the Lord for himself, and then becomes a disciple of Jesus.

I bring this up because the truth is, we in our ministries at Hope and Glen Flora have a wonderful gift to share with the world around us, starting right here in our own communities! We have been blessed with the gifts of forgiveness of our sins and everlasting life in paradise through the person and work of Jesus Christ on our behalf. Through the life, death, and resurrection of Christ, we are a people who have hope in the midst of so much darkness and bad news that is in our world today. As we continue to focus our ministry together as a congregation around the four core values of the North American Lutheran Church: Christ-Centered, Mission-Driven, Traditionally-Grounded, and Congregationally-Focused, we are called to be salt and light to the world around us, starting right here in rural Rusk County, Wisconsin! In a day and age where many church bodies are wandering further and further away from Christ and His Word, we have made a commitment to remain steadfast in Christ and His Word that gives us life, hope, forgiveness, and salvation!

But we haven't been called to keep this to ourselves. We are called to share it with others in our daily lives. That's where you all come in.

There was a study done several years ago that interviewed people who had joined a new church. The question they were asked was how were they brought into the life of the church they ended up joining in the first place? Two percent said it was a result of an advertisement in the newspaper or somewhere else. Six percent said it was from a personal invitation from the Pastor. Another six percent said they came into the church for the first time as a result of a specific evangelism emphasis or program that congregation was involved with. **The remaining eighty-six percent said they started going to that particular church because someone they knew, a friend, relative, or neighbor, invited them to come to church with them, extending the same invitation Philip extended to Nathaniel in our reading.**

As we continue through the summer months, I have a challenge for each of you. I'd like for you to think about the people you know in your daily lives whom you might be a Philip to and invite them to church here at Hope or Glen Flora with you to experience what

Jesus is up to in our life together as the church in these places. Can you think of someone in your own life who you haven't seen here at church in a while? Do you know of a neighbor or friend who isn't happy with where they are at church-wise right now and needs to hear about all of the positive things that are happening in our ministry together in this place? Do you know of someone who recently moved to the area, or has lived here for quite some time, and needs the light of Jesus Christ in their life? People you know in each of these categories and more are people who need Jesus Christ, the Light of the World, the Light no darkness can overcome in their lives! Can you imagine what might take place in our congregations if each and every one of us took this kind of initiative with just one person by simply inviting them to "come and see" Jesus for themselves?

I hope and pray that you are enjoying the somewhat relaxed pace that summer often brings and pray for God's blessings to be with each and every one of you. I look forward to seeing you in church as we continue to grow in our faith, and in our witness to Christ in all we say and do!

Mission Statement


Hope Lutheran Church is commissioned to make disciples, commanded to love God and other, and committed to serve.
