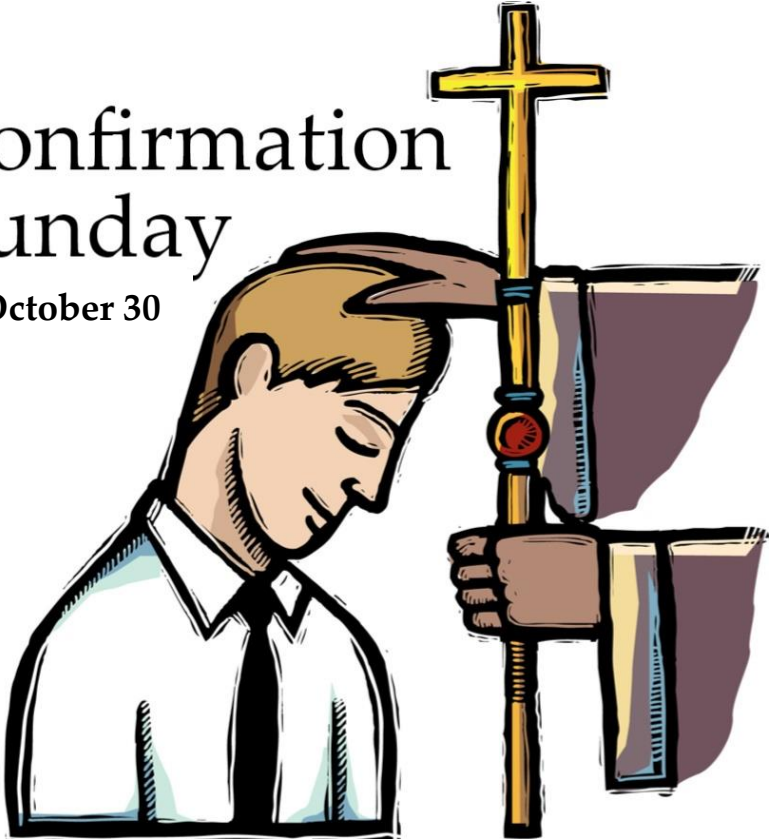

A Pastoral Parable

As we move further into fall, I want to share with you a parable of sorts. It is a parable that perhaps you might be able to relate to that helps to illustrate the point I would like to make with this month's article.

Our story takes place in a small, rural community like Rusk County. Like most places, during the week it wasn't uncommon for farmers or retired folks living in town to gather at the local coffee shop for a cup of coffee, some baked goods, and conversation about different topics.

One Monday morning, two men, named Bob and Joe, who happened to belong to the same church in the community, were talking with another friend named Dave, who hadn't gone to church anywhere for several years. The conversation that day went something like this:

Bob: Hey Joe, I didn't like the hymns we sang yesterday. None of them were my favorite. What was that Pastor thinking when he chose the hymns?

Joe: Yeah, Bob, I know. I also didn't like the song the choir sang yesterday. It wasn't what I normally expect them to sing.

Bob: And then there was that family that had the small children that just wouldn't be quiet during the sermon! I don't understand why the parents never take them out of church?

Joe: Yeah. We have sound from the sanctuary that feeds downstairs, so why won't they take their noisy, obnoxious kids out of the church? It was bad enough that a new couple sat in my pew yesterday—I was already uncomfortable having to sit closer to that guy I don't get along with—but it was almost too much!

The conversation continued like this for a good half hour, with Bob and Joe continuing to share complaints and harsh criticisms about their church, the pastor, musicians, council members, and anyone else that they felt were not meeting their expectations, despite not taking the time to talk with any of them. Finally, after all of this, they turned to their friend, Dave, and invited him to come to church with them the following week, because they needed more active members, and Dave happened to have small children at home. What do you think Dave's response was to that invitation?

While he didn't say it out loud, Dave's thoughts were, "Why in the world would I want to go to church there, or anywhere for that matter, when all these guys do is complain about the church and fight with people within it? I can get that anywhere else!"

In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus calls us—His disciples—to be about one thing: making disciples of all nations. The means we use are the Word and the Sacraments, which are gifts from God to us through His Son, Jesus Christ, which we receive in worship. How do we make more disciples of Jesus? By telling other people in our lives about Jesus, and inviting them to "come and see" Jesus here at Hope Flora Lutheran Church!

The question I have for you is this: when you speak of our church when you are not here, what are you talking about? Are you telling people about the fact that the good news of Jesus is proclaimed in our midst? Are you sharing about the work our Sunday School is doing at Hope, our VBS this past summer, or that we are simply blessed to have children in our congregation almost every Sunday when many churches have none? Are we inviting our friends to join us for the adult education opportunities we offer? Are you telling them about many of the other things that are going on in our church, such as our support for different mission projects, our care for one another in a time of need, the people who give of their time to visit homebound members or people in nursing homes, often assisting me in distributing Holy Communion to these people so they can remain connected to the work of our church and our Savior, Jesus? Do we give credit to the HLCW, who do so much in our church, or our sewing group that meets monthly, who make quilts for the NALC Disaster Response ministries? Are we sharing the exciting things

that are happening in the North American Lutheran Church, and our commitment to the Authority of Scripture, which is lacking in many churches in our area today? When we share these things that the Holy Spirit is doing in our midst, and focus on those, instead of the things we don't like, or the people we don't like in our church, why wouldn't we want to invite people in our lives to be a part of our family of faith and see what God is up to in our midst?

Or are we often more like Bob and Joe, and spend our time complaining that things aren't "my way" when we speak of our church when we are out and about in the community? Do we, through what we say and do in daily life, give a witness to someone else that says: "What difference does it make to be a Christian if that person claims to be a part of the body of Christ, but still continues to act as if faith in Jesus doesn't make a difference?"

Did you know that when it comes to a person's decision to join a particular church, that 86 percent do so because they were first invited by a friend or family member? Can you imagine what the Holy Spirit can do in our midst if we take the time to be more intentional about talking about what's happening in the life of our church, and invite others to be a part of what God is doing in our midst?

I want to take this opportunity to challenge each and every one of you to think about a person that you know, who either hasn't been to church here in a while, that doesn't have a church home, or isn't going to church anywhere. Pray about how you might be an instrument to connect them to Jesus Christ, and what He's doing in the life of our church. Think about who you see on a regular basis that you might be able to take time to build a relationship with, and perhaps use it as an opportunity to share Jesus with them. You have a golden opportunity to be a part of Jesus' mission here in rural Rusk County, Wisconsin! I pray that we accept this challenge, speak well of our church in our daily life, and continue to seek out Jesus' gifts of forgiveness and life in worship on Sunday morning, in daily reading of Scripture, and prayer in our own lives, and in our conversations with others.

I look forward to seeing you, and your guests, in church!

Hospital Visitation

In 1999 the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPPA), which deals with the privacy of patient information, was enacted. Because of these laws, facilities such as hospitals, nursing homes, rehabilitation centers, assisted living facilities, medical clinics, hospice providers, and others who provide care in an inpatient facility or in the home are by law not permitted to contact pastors or churches with patient information such as: admittance, the patient's condition, or their treatments. When you or someone you love is hospitalized, admitted to a care facility, assisted living, hospice, or other in-home care programs, the church does not receive a call or notification from the facility regarding that admittance.

While Pastor Martin is always happy to visit when you are in need, he needs to know where you are and what is going on in order to do so. If you have a surgery or other admittance planned in advance and you'd like a visit, please contact the church office ahead of time with the information about where and when your surgery is so he can plan to visit you at the hospital or upon your return home. If your hospitalization is unexpected and you want Pastor Martin to be aware of it, be sure to have a family member call the church to let us know what is happening so that we can respond as needed or desired with a visit and/or prayer.

Please also be aware that while some of the restrictions on clergy visitation that were in place due to COVID have been eased, not every facility permits a pastor to visit as they could pre-pandemic. Visitation protocols change depending upon the level of community spread. Pastor Martin will check with the facility before heading out to make a visit to ensure that he will be allowed to see you.

If you need to contact Pastor Martin for visitation needs, please call the church office (715-532-7739). During the day Bonnie will contact Pastor Martin immediately. If it is after hours, please wait for the voicemail greeting to give you instructions on how to reach Pastor Martin in an emergency or immediate need, or to leave a private voice message for him.
