#### "Renewal in Christ"

"Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect." (Romans 12:2, ESV)

As many of you are aware, for the last 4 years going back to my last call in lowa, I've been honored to serve the wider church as part of the National Renewal Team in the Missions Office of the North American Lutheran Church (NALC). Over the course of that time, our team has been working hard to address the needs of our existing congregations in the NALC, in particular, the need for congregational renewal in our small and rural churches, which make up the vast majority of the congregational base of the NALC. While this was an important topic before COVID, it's become an even more important topic today as our churches, Hope and Glen Flora included, continue to emerge from that difficult period of our history, and find that we're facing a lot of challenges in our ministries today.

So as we talk about "renewal", the question we have to answer is this: what does "renewal" mean, and is it something we need in the life of our congregations, or in our individual spiritual lives today? The New Testament Greek word that is translated as "renewal" in our reading from Romans 12 I quoted at the beginning of the article comes from a root word that means: "renovation" or "a complete change of heart or mind."

Theologically speaking, the conversation of "renewal" gets to the heart of the daily life of the Christian! And do we ever need it today!

I don't recall a time in my life (and I know I've heard some of you reflect the same on your life experience too) where people were so angry and there was so much political and social unrest as what we have witnessed in recent years. And instead of getting any better, it's getting worse. It's no coincidence that as this is happening, fewer and fewer people are identifying themselves as Christians, and there is an ever-growing segment of our population that claims "no religious affiliation" and the church's influence in our community and society continue to decline.

If there has ever been a time in my years of ministry that we need renewal, it's today!

So, how will be bring about renewal in our own spiritual lives, and in the life of Hope and Glen Flora Lutheran Churches, and across the North American Lutheran Church? It comes by renewing our minds and our hearts! It means asking ourselves the question "why are we here?" I firmly believe that our best years in both churches are not behind us. They are ahead of us. However, that doesn't mean that they'll look the same way they did in the "golden years", whatever point of reference that might be for you. I believe that in order for us to continue to offer a dynamic, impactful ministry in the years to come, it will happen as we take to heart the words of Paul in our verse from Romans 12. Let's not get caught up in the way the world defines success through a chase after numbers. Let's instead renew our hearts and minds through the Word of God, the Scriptures, which point us to our Savior, Jesus Christ. As we center our lives, and everything we do in our families, and in our congregations, and yes, even together as a parish, around Christ and His gifts to us in Word and Sacrament, we will find renewal.

You see, as we renew ourselves in God's Word on a daily basis, as we lay our sins and failings at the foot of the Cross, and receive anew each day God's gift of forgiveness through the blood of Jesus Christ, we will find true renewal. We will be set free from the world's demands that can never be satisfied. We will find true peace with God, and assurance that whatever we face in this life, we face with Christ by our side. We will find the promise of everlasting life with God in paradise because of Jesus' death and resurrection to be the most important thing we seek. And thus, having been renewed by

the Word of God, our focus will change from being inward on ourselves and what makes us comfortable, to wanting to share the hope that is within us with our world.

In the coming months, you are going to hear from me about opportunities to renew our lives in Christ through the NALC's Life-to-Life Discipleship resources. It is my hope that in both congregations, to find individuals who would like to go on this journey with me, and be equipped for the task of being disciples of Jesus Christ, who seek to make disciples of Jesus Christ, one life at a time! I pray that our program year at Hope and Glen Flora will be a blessing as we continue some of our traditional programs, begin some new areas of ministry, and most importantly, as we seek to come together around God's gifts of Word and Sacrament in our churches each week, and equip ourselves for the ministry of joining Jesus on His mission of redemption right here in Rusk County, one life at a time.

## **Backpack Food Program**

The Hope & Friends Backpack Food Program is beginning its eighth in the Ladysmith Elementary and Middle schools, providing nutritious foods to children on the weekends when school meals are not available. We are also making our program available to high school students through Power House Youth Center. Students in the LHS special education program partner with us and do the packaging of the food. Volunteers also assist with the packaging and handle distribution of the food packs.

Children are supplied with two 2-4-ounce cereals, two entrees, a fruit, a vegetable, soup and some snacks (granola bars, crackers and even some chocolates) for weekends when school meals are not provided. Extended vacation times may also include jars of peanut butter and jelly and coupons for a half gallon of milk, a dozen eggs and a loaf of bread. There is no cost to the families or school district.

The program receives assistance and funding from a number of local churches, civic organizations, and individuals. Kwik Trip and Feed My People Food Bank have been great supporters, as well. Fundraising for the 2022-23 school year has begun. Donations can be placed in the offering box or dropped off in the church office. Checks should be made payable to the Hope & Friends Backpack Food Program.

## **Food Pantry**

The Hope Lutheran Food Pantry serves those in need throughout Rusk County. The Pantry is open Mondays 1:00-3:00pm, and Fridays 9:30-11:30am. The Pantry will be closed on Monday, September 5.

Volunteers are also needed on Tuesday, September 6 and Monday, September 19 to help unload the Feed My People delivery and to stock shelves. If you can help out, please be to the church by 9:15am.

Donations of non-perishable food items can be brought to the church during office hours or on Sunday mornings. Monetary donations can be sent to the church office or placed in the offering plate (clearly marked "Food Pantry").


