"I AM THE RESURRECTION AND THE LIFE... DO YOU BELIEVE THIS?"

As I begin this article, I wish to begin by saying "Thank You" for the messages of condolence many of you have sent to me upon the recent deaths of my aunt, Pat Nelson, and a close family friend, Joan Nielsen. While I know it isn't always easy to have the Pastor away on such short notice, my family and I deeply appreciate your understanding of our need to return to lowa for a short time.

Because of the reason for my recent return trip home to lowa, my mind has been on the words of Jesus from John 11:25-26: "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, and everyone who lives and believes in me shall never die. Do you believe this?"

I can't tell you how many times over the 15 years I've served as a parish pastor I've spoken these words or preached on them in funeral sermons in every single church I've served during that time. However, these words have taken on a special meaning for me recently, as, in the midst of my own grief over losing two people who were a source of support throughout my ministry, I've found a considerable amount of comfort in these words of our Lord and Savior. Jesus.

When Jesus first speaks these words, it's to his close friend, Martha, who is mourning over the recent death of her brother, Lazarus. By the time Jesus arrives in Bethany, it's been four days since Lazarus has died. The funeral service has been held. The procession from the place of the funeral to the grave has taken place. Lazarus' lifeless body was laid in the tomb, and a stone was rolled in place to seal the tomb. It seems that death wins out.

But we discover that's not the end of the story, is it? Indeed, Jesus is the resurrection and the life! He raises Lazarus from the dead in John 11. Later in the New Testament, we learn that Jesus, by His own death and resurrection, has become the first fruits of the resurrection, meaning there is more to come.

When we are called to mourn the deaths of those who we love who have died in the faith, we're posed with the same question from Jesus that He posed to Martha as she was in the midst of mourning her brother's death...do you believe this? What about you, personally? Do you believe that Jesus Christ is the resurrection and the life? Do you believe that, as you center your life in Jesus Christ, and His Word, as you place your faith and trust in Him and Him alone for life and salvation, that you will live forever with Him, even though there will come a day when your eyelids close in death? Do you believe that for our loved ones who die in faith in Jesus Christ, that death was not the end, but was merely the vehicle that God uses to bring us from the pain, suffering, and sorrow we often face in this sinful, dying world, to the eternal joy and life in paradise with Him? Do you believe this?

Many in our community, and the world, sadly, do not believe this. For them, death is something they fear. Thus, they refuse to talk about it. But, for those of us who center our lives in Christ, we don't have a reason to fear death. We know it's not the end, and it doesn't have the final say!

Soon, we will enter the season of Lent, when we often follow Jesus through His passion and death. But as we follow Him in each of these places, we remember we do so with the empty tomb in sight. We know death doesn't get the last say, Jesus does.

If you happen to be mourning the death of your loved ones who have fallen asleep in Christ Jesus, remember, while death's sting may creep up on you when you least expect, it won't last forever. There will come a time where you are reunited with your loved ones who have died in the faith and now rest with Christ! With this in mind, I encourage you to center your life, and place your hope for life in this world, and for your eternal life, solely in the mercy of Jesus. Look to Him to be the source of your life and your faith. Let

go of whatever it is that's holding you back from clinging to Christ alone. And in our lives together as the body of Christ in our church, let's let go of everything we hold to that doesn't serve the proclamation of the Gospel, and instead, let's stay focused on our Savior, Jesus, and His promise of life and salvation found in His Word alone. My prayer for each and every one of you is that when Jesus asks you: "Do you believe that I am the resurrection and the life?", you would confidently say, as both Pat and Joan could answer beyond the shadow of a doubt, "Yes, Lord, I believe!"

GriefShare

The first series of the GriefShare support group will wrap-up on Wednesday, February 8. The group has been a positive experience for both the participants and leaders. A nice feature of the program is that, even though it is a 13-week cycle, each session is self-contained so people do not have to attend in sequence and can pick up any sessions they missed in the next cycle. Each participant receives a workbook with activities that can be completed during the week. Each 90-minute session consists of 15-20 minutes of discussion of the workbook exercises, a 40-minute DVD presentation by experts in the field of grief, and 25-30 minutes to discuss the DVD topics.

The second GriefShare cycle will begin on March 2 and end on May 24. Meetings are held downstairs in the fellowship hall.


March: All Thursdays during Lent from 6:00-7:30pm.
